The National Outcomes and Casemix Collection (NOCC) is a suite of measures used in public mental health services across Australia. The measures can provide a consistent way of gathering information about a person, particularly their symptoms and functioning, as they access our services. The measures can therefore support care planning and describe the outcomes of care.

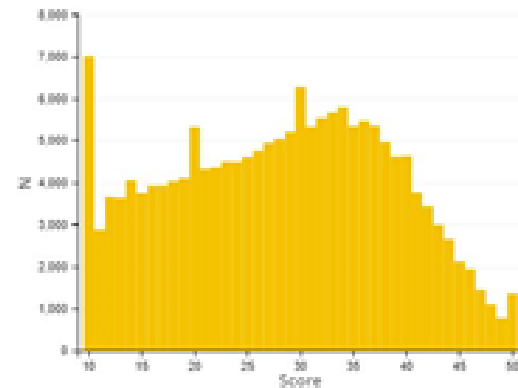

Collection of the K-10+ in Adult Ambulatory Services

The chart presented here from the wDST shows the total score frequency distribution for the consumer completed measure, the Kessler-10+ (K-10+), on admission to Adult Ambulatory Services.

During training, clinicians express concern that consumers may not be engaged with the completion of the measure and rate at the extremes - "none of the time" or "all of the time".

The results shown here should offer reassurance as only 4.2% of nearly 170,000 collected measures are rated "none of the time" for every item, and only 0.8% are rated "all of the time" for every item.

Collection of the K-10+ in Adult Inpatient Services

Similar results are found for the K-10+ measure collected on admission to Inpatient Services. Of the approximately 120,000 completed measures, around 4% are rated "none of the time" for every item and around 2% are rated "all of the time" for every item.

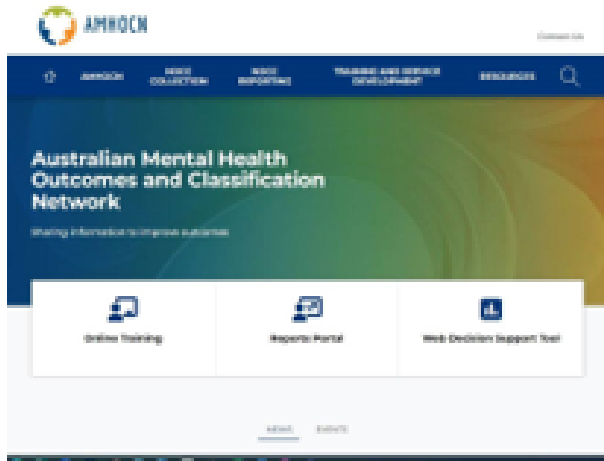

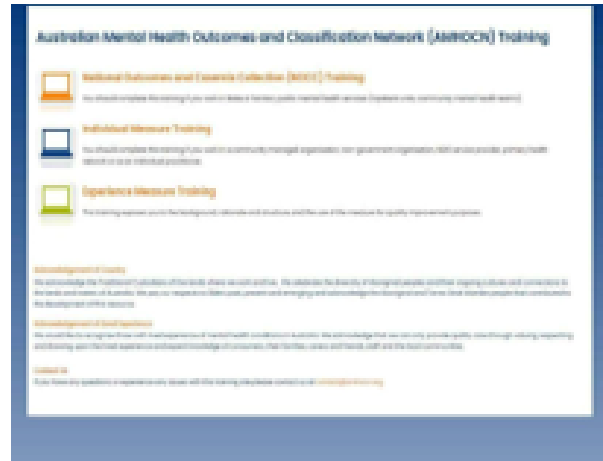

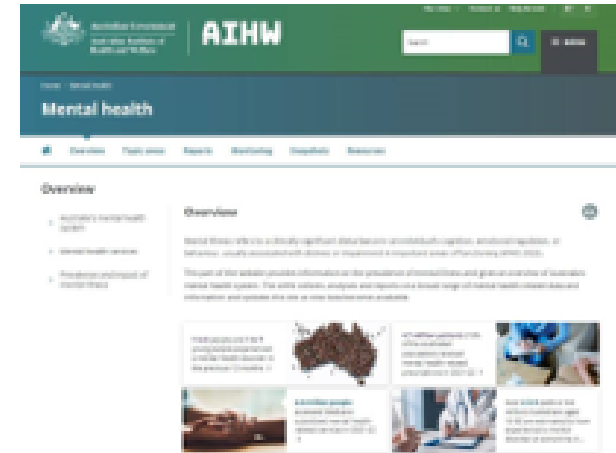
AMHOCN Website
